The Modoc War: A Homeland Lost Audio Tour

An interactive history tour for the young, and the young at heart. Learn much of the history of how the Klamath Basin came to be on this audio tour with highlights featuring Lava Beds National Monument, mastodon tusks, and more!



Downtown Walking Tour

During the 1920's Klamath Falls was the fastest growing city in Oregon, and with that came a variety of Art Deco & Gothic Revival architectural influences ranging from the buildings themselves to the murals around downtown. Revel in it all during the self-guided walking tour through the downtown core. Don't forget your camera!



Tulelake National Wildlife Refuge Auto Tour

The Tulelake NWR encompasses 39,116 acres of mostly open water and croplands. A 12 mile auto tour route allows wildlife observation year-round. Large geese flocks, grebes, herons, egrets, hawks and eagles, towhees, wrens, titmouse, White-throated sparrows, and Northern Mockingbirds are only the start of regularly seen bird species on this route.
