# Oregon Outdoor Recreation Outfitter and Guide Relief Grant Program Application Questions

The application process requires the Oregon resident Outdoor Recreation Outfitter and Guide to be registered with the Oregon State Marine Board prior to March 1, 2020. The applicant must also hold a current (2022) Oregon resident Outfitter and Guide registration or have applied to the Oregon State Marine Board to renew registration by April 30, 2022.

This document provides you with the questions that will be asked in the Oregon Outdoor Recreation Outfitter and Guide Relief Grant Program application. **DO NOT use this document as your application.** Final applications must be completed ONLINE through Travel Oregon's grant management system. The online application will open **April 29, 2022, at 8 a.m. PDT.** All applications must be submitted by **May 13, 2022, at 5 p.m. PDT.**

## Before continuing, please confirm you meet the eligibility criteria.

You must meet **ALL** of the following eligibility criteria to apply. Please confirm all of the following are true by checking each box. If you do not meet ALL of the below requirements, please do NOT continue with the application. **Only one application per guiding business may be submitted**. For guiding businesses with multiple owners: Owners must determine which registered Outfitter and Guide among them will submit the application on behalf of the business. **If multiple applications are submitted for a single business, they will be disqualified from receiving a grant award.**

- 4. Had guiding business financial losses due to restrictions imposed by the COVID-19 pandemic or service disruption related to drought or wildfire.
- 5. Has registered my guiding business with the Oregon Secretary of State, if required by Oregon law.
- 6. Can provide required business information and documentation, ownership information and optional demographic information, as applicable. Information and documentation include, but is not limited to:
  - Name of company
  - Address of company
  - IRS Form W-9 and Employee Identification (EIN) (As taken from the W-9)
  - Maximum number of employees on file with the Oregon State Marine Board for the loss period



- 3. A loss of year-over-year Oregon gross revenue greater than 25% between calendar year 2019 and calendar year 2021 ("2019, 2021")
- Select which Revenue Loss Period you attest to Oregon guiding business financial losses due to the restrictions imposed by the COVID-19 pandemic or service disruption related to drought or wildfire. (You may only claim one loss period and must have been registered with the Oregon State Marine Board and operated during both calendar years of the Revenue Loss Period):

Examples of how to calculate financial loss:



Period selected by applicant, January 1, 2020 – December 31, 2021

Sum Gross Revenue per period (revenue from all Outfitter and Guide activities in period)

January 1, 2020 – December 31, 2020 = \$30,000

January 1, 2021 – December 31, 2021 = \$21,000

Financial loss = \$30,000 minus \$21,000 = \$9,000

25% loss of greater revenue = \$30,000 (2020 revenue) multiply by 0.25 (25/100) = \$7,500

Applicant percent loss = \$9,000 (loss) divide by higher revenue \$30,000 (2019 revenue) = 0.30 = 30% ---- losses qualify as > 25% loss
