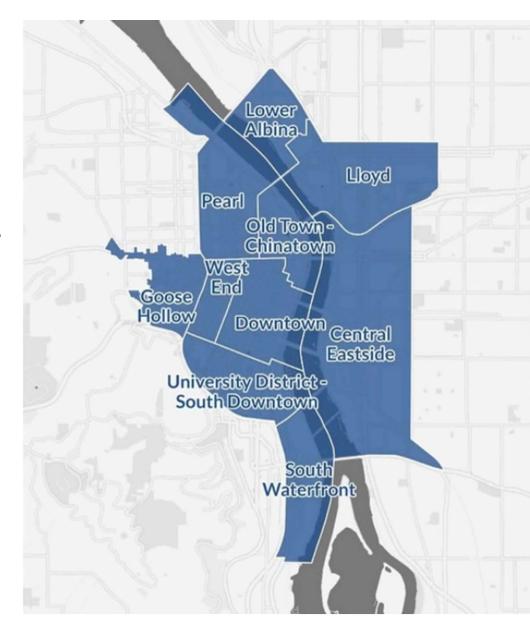


# PORTLAND CENTRAL CITY TASK FORCE

# PORTLAND CENTRAL CITY TASK FORCE

Recommendation 3: Pursue state grants to support event and public space activations and remove barriers to holding events

- Convene in late '23 or early '24 to identify impactful investments for activations that will drive visitation and room nights ...
- Travel Oregon can designate ... resources within their 2023-2025 biennial budget to support Central City activations.
- Travel Oregon and Travel Portland should also explore ways that Travel Oregon's Regional Cooperative Tourism Program (RCTP) may support Central City activations as part of the Portland Region's 2024-25 RCTP plan.
- Consider funding organizations for longer timeframes (e.g., 3 to 5 years)

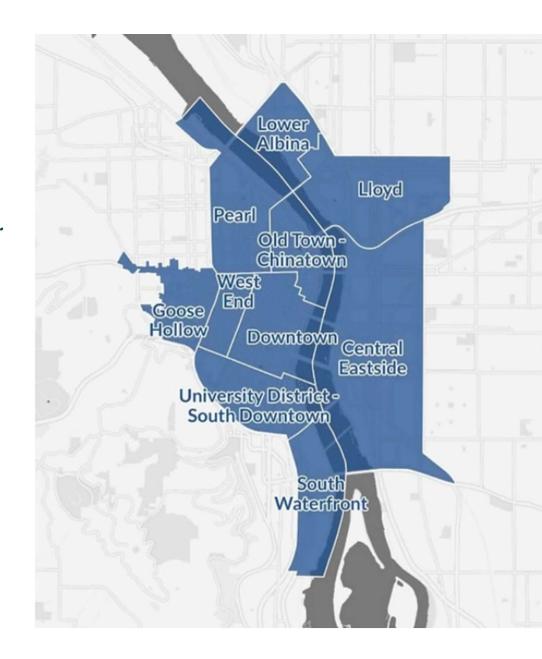

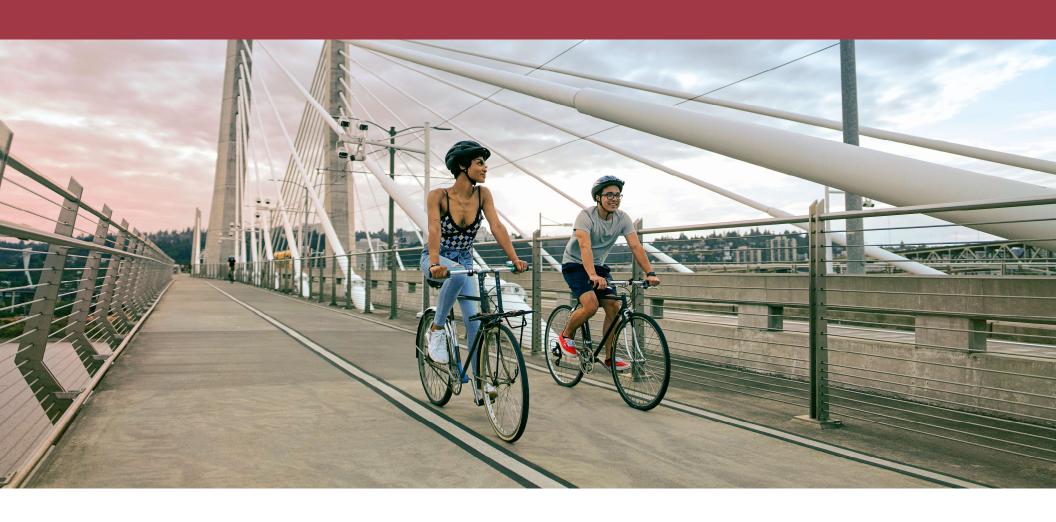




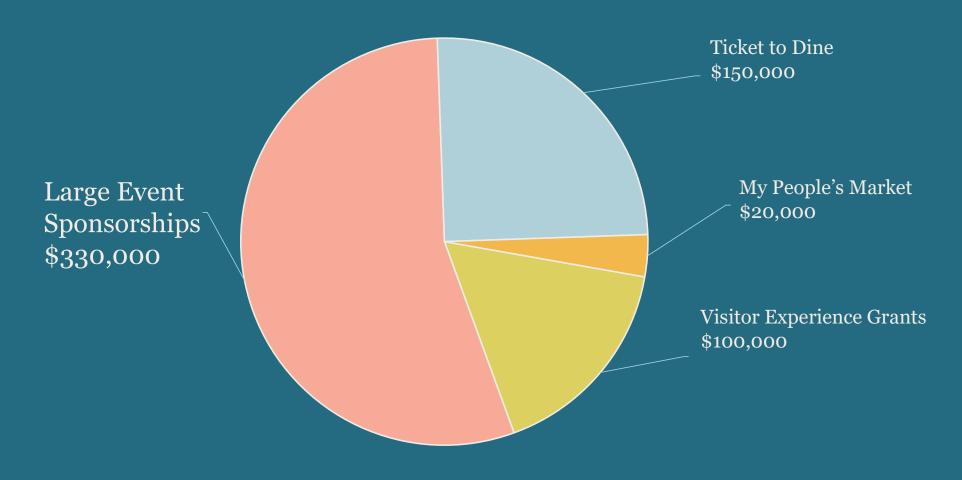

Oregon's biggest city has long appealed to outdoor lovers, with its 250-plus public parks; the Willamette River, which runs through the heart of the city; and a growing network of paved multiuse trails that has resulted in a 5 percent increase in biking since 2022, according to the Portland Bureau of Transportation. Now there are new, enticing reasons to visit this laid-back Pacific Northwest city. Late 2024 saw the opening of Cascada, Portland's first underground thermal springs spa and eco-hotel, located in the Alberta Arts District, and in 2025, a \$111 million renovation of the Portland Art Museum will bring an additional 100,000 square feet to the building, including the creation of new galleries and a Mark Rothko Pavilion. Plus, with big-ticket infrastructure upgrades, like the \$2 billion redevelopment of Portland International Airport — the country's friendliest — which has a new, nature-inspired main terminal, it all becomes easier to access. — Jessica Vadillo

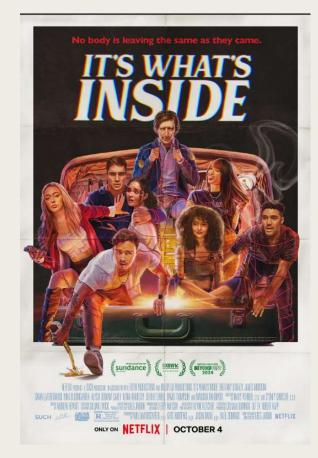
#### Film in Portland-2024

The media production industry has had a major growth year in 2024 in Portland and within the entire State.

We began 2024 at Sundance film festival, where Portland created Netflix thriller "Its What's Inside" landed the largest distribution deal at \$17 million.

In June of 2024 Portland began filming its largest on location television series to date. Amazon Studios "Criminal" employed over 300 cast and crew members, used over 60 permitted locations in the Portland metro area, and worked with over 100 small businesses and vendors.

#### 2024 — Film Tourism



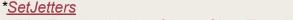






Film Tourism app \*SetJetters estimates that over 100 million people a year are inspired to travel by film and TV.

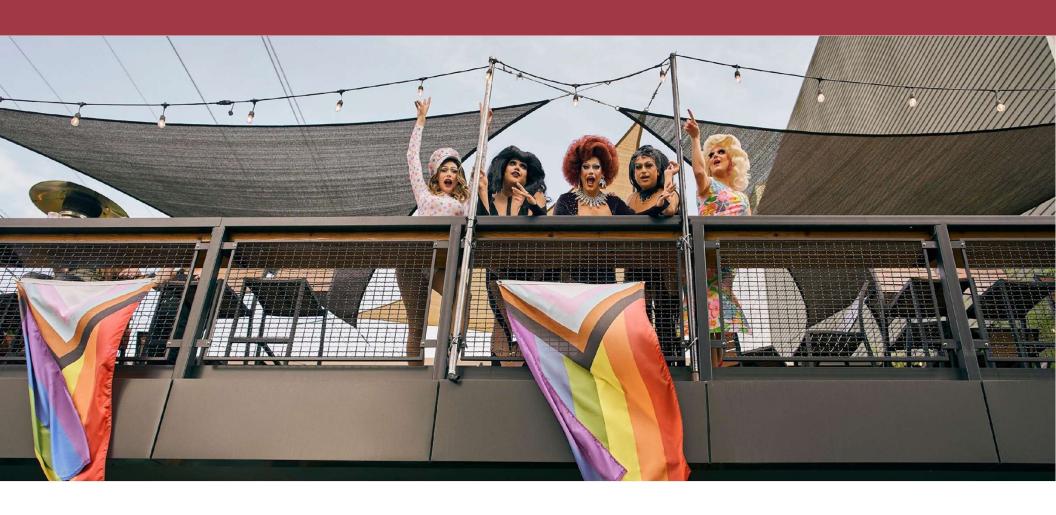
- SetJetters has partnered with the Oregon Film Trail to highlight over 40 iconic Oregon film locations.
- Films such as Wild, The Goonies, Twilight and Halloweentown consistently see over 100,000 visitors a year and the economic impact of those visits in a decade will be over 5 times their direct spend.
- Events such as the *Coraline* 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary Cat Trail boost foot traffic and tourism in the central city.
- \*\*Future market insights the film tourism market size is estimated to surpass \$66.9 million in 2023 and is projected to reach \$118.6 million by 2033.
