Columbia County, Oregon



- 25 minutes north of Portland, 45 minutes east of the Coast
- 53,000 residents
- Six distinct cities, multiple communities
- 62 miles of Columbia River
- VERY little TLT
 - o 3 lodging properties (120 rooms)
 - o 5 Campgrounds; 160 campsites
- Scarcity of marketable, economically productive, developed destinations

MAKING CONNECTIONS

- Joined Oregon Frontier Chamber of Commerce in June 2023, K Lynn Lane gave us the spark!!
 - She hosted a visioning meeting with City Council, Community Members, and Streetview Planning
 - Introduced us to Dark Sky initiatives and grant opportunities
- July 2023 a Sky Quality Meter was Installed Kickstarted applying for Grants
- August 2023 Developed relationship with Washington Family Ranch for donating Cabins, had Dark Sky presentations to City Council, and started design on a cabin resort
- September 2023 applied for Cycle Oregon and Travel Oregon Grants
- October 2023 FAM Tour in Antelope (South Wasco Alliance)







GRANT INVESTMENTS

- Cycle Oregon Awarded \$18,750 for Phase 1 of Antelope Pavilion
- Travel Oregon Awarded \$38,500 to fund the ADA required costs of placing cabins
- Visit Central Oregon Awarded \$50,000 to fund the Phase 2 of Antelope Pavilion to build the exterior shell



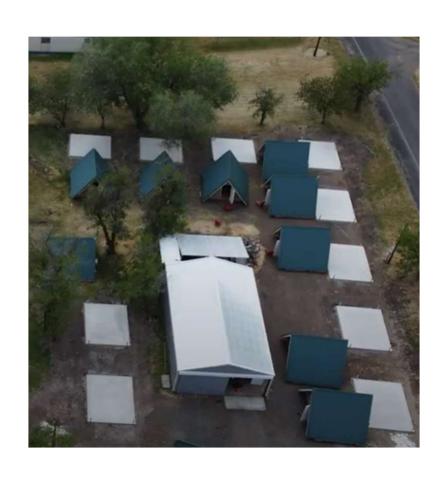




CHALLENGES FACED – TRANSPORTING THE CABINS

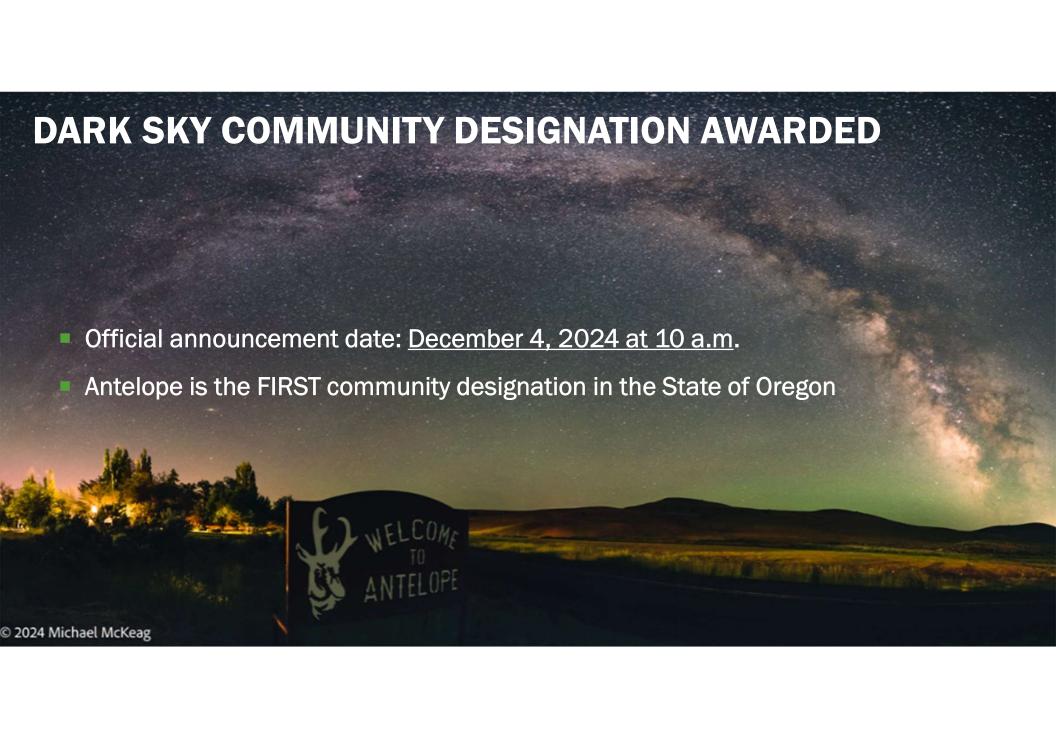




NEXT STEPS

- Finish Cabins (\$15,000)
 - Exterior Paint, Interior furnishings
- Finish ADA required additions (\$66,000)
 - ADA Bathroom \$24,000
 - Interconnect Cabin Pathways to Pavilion Pathways \$28,000
 - ADA Parking Spaces (2) \$14,000
- Finish Non-ADA bathrooms (\$26,000)
- Finish Non-ADA parking areas (\$6,000)
- Enhancements
 - Telescope viewing pads with ADA access and projector setup (cost unknown)
 - Met with local Astronomer Grant Tandy to assist with Pad design and partnering ideas for visual screens
 - Dark Sky Lighting fixtures (all pathway lights and Dark Sky approved fixtures and bulbs) – approximately \$12,000
 - Apply for Dark Sky Lodging designation once lighting is changed
 - Signage and information kiosks (specifically bike friendly, Dark Sky info, and caters to international travelers) – (cost unknown)
 - Convert Shop Building to a game room/bike shop. Cost Unknown
 - Outdoor seating furniture upgrades





OTHER INITIATIVES

- Adopted TRT Ordinance for City of Antelope in June 2024 5% paid to City
- FireWise Grant \$75,000 awarded to help with defensible space this will help cleaning up the town
- Ford Family Foundation is supporting a consultant to help with long term community visioning
- Working with Antelope Museum to see what it would take to open (w/ Win McCormack)
- Oregon Community Foundation Awarded \$25,000 for Thriving Entrepreneur Program (technical assistance)
- Antelope School Community Center restoration efforts to support large event space



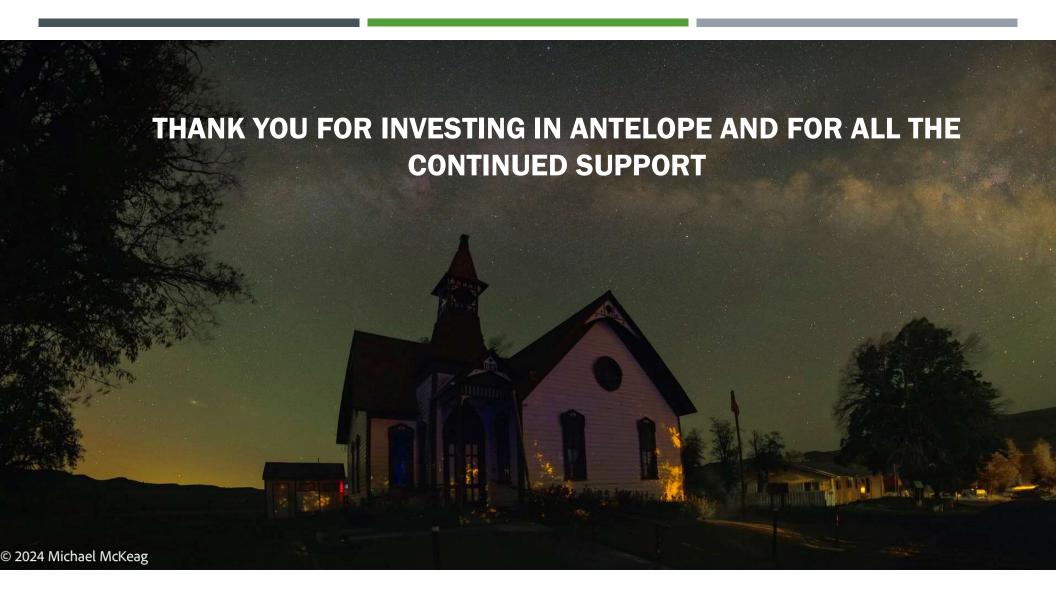


MISSION

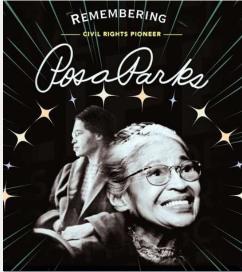

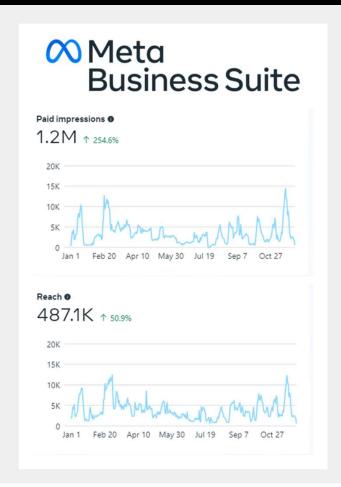
